Electronic Medical Records

■ Benefits

- Test results are available more quickly
- Easier to share information with other providers
- Reduces error by having up to date information
- Allows patients more control of and understanding of their own medical information – more transparent
- The more you know the more you can be involved in the decision making

How can the Care Notebook help me?

- The Care Notebook is simply a filing system, but it is also a way to get to know your child's issues in an organized way, makes it easier for you to tell others what you want for your child



How can the Care Notebook help me?

- It is tempting in a parent's busy day to day life to use the "pager bag system" of filing. However, inevitably when you want to put your hands quickly on information necessary to get services and help others understand your needs, you will be grateful to yourself for having filed the information in an easy-to-find order.



Cardinal Rules

- Give it in writing. Get it in writing.
Know where it is.
- If it isn't in writing, it didn't happen.

How can the EZ Access Notebook help me?

- Track changes in your child's medical care and needs
- Keep phone numbers handy
- Track status of action steps and communications



How can the EZ Access Notebook help me?

- Add new information and documents
- Keep track of and prepare for appointments
- Take the notebook with you to appointments or the ER so you will have information easily available



How to put together your Notebook

Many generic and disability specific notebooks are available, don't really need an example, just put things on a flash drive even...the organization is up to you!

Top Ten Reasons

10. Allows you to track your child's progress.
9. Makes it easy to share information with other service systems and providers.
8. Helps you feel more “in control”



Top Ten Reasons

7. Aids participation as a member of your child's care teams.
6. Allows you to advocate more effectively for your child because you have documentation for your requests.
5. It sends a positive message



Top Ten Reasons

4. If you have to appeal decisions, you have documentation of what has occurred.
3. It helps you prepare for appointments and meetings
2. It is empowering



Top Ten Reasons

1. It gives your memory a break.
